

6/12/56 to 10/16/67. The bell sits on a base that is constructed from White Oak Hose Bed Racks of Apparatus D-222, Hose Body 1950-1000 G.P.M., Class "A" Pumper, built by Peter Hirsch Co. of Kenosha, Wisconsin.

Located on the south side of North Avenue between Rockwell and Maplewood (hope I have that correct). It was the smallest movie house I had ever seen, then and now. Who owned it? Who ran it? When did it start and when did it close? Did Luigi's restaurant take it's place?

Olsen Rug's gorgeous garden where many of us spent some time. Olson Rug Company was established in 1874. The manufacturing mill was located in Chicago at Diversey Ave. and Pulaski. During the war era (WWII), when raw material was scarce, people would send in their old wool rugs, rags, clothing etc. and Olson Rug would turn them into a beautiful area rug. The family owned business was "the place" to buy rugs for many years. Alongside the factory was the renowned Olson Memorial Park. Walter E. Olson built the 22 acre park in 1935. The project took nearly six months to complete. About 800 tons of stone and 800 yards of soil were used for its construction. Approximately 3,500 perennials were used along with numerous species of junipers, spruces, pines, arbor-vitaes and annuals. The park consisted of a stunning rock garden, duck pond and 35-foot waterfall. Olson Park became a popular spot for family outings. During the first Sunday after its dedication Olson Park attracted as many as 600 visitors per hour. In 1965, Olson Rug sold its building to Marshall Fields. In the 1970s the waterfall was turned off and the park was dismantled to make room for a parking lot. Today, Olson Rug & Flooring is a Chicago base, 11 store chain who's main business is retail residential floor covering. The Olson Rug stores sell a wide variety of carpet, area rugs, hardwood flooring, laminate floors, ceramic tile and vinyl flooring.
