Principals of Moos School

There have been 16 Principals at Moos since 1897, 10 women and 6 men. The 1st Principal was **Minna S. Heuerman 1897-1898** and today's Principal is **Maria E. Cruz 2005 - Present.** The Principals during our tender years were:

Roy F. Webster 1927-1940, Robert E. Lakemacher 1940-1945, Marie A. Tobin 1947-1961, Helen D. Wilke 1961-1976.

Fire Engine Co. 111 History

Fire Engine Company 111 was put into operation on October 31st, 1907 and ended it's service at 10:50 hours on January 22nd, 1968. The building, at 1701 N. Washtenaw Ave. (originally the street number was 902). Engine 111 was taken out of service on October 16th, 1967 and replaced by Snorkel 5, the first time a Chicago Snorkel was the sole occupant of a fire house. The building was razed in the spring of 1963.
